Royal's Brunei Armed Forces celebrate 53rd Anniversary

His Majesty delivers a *titah* highlighting the needs of a strategic thinking approach.

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, May 31 - All efforts to upgrade capability must be planned in more systematic ways, based on the principle of "Raise, Train and Sustain," so that the Forces can carry out its operational responsibilities more effectively and efficiently with more confidence.

His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, the Minister of Defence and Supreme Commander of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces, stated that spending and procurements must be carried out wisely, and not by making rushed moves that could incur imprudent spending.

His Majesty made the calls in a *titah* in conjunction with the Royal Brunei Armed Forces' (RBAF) 53rd Anniversary held at the Royal Brunei Air Force Base in Rimba.

His Majesty added that with the RBAF being a large and dynamic institution, it would be appropriate for each of its sections and units to continue to keep

a grasp of their respective planning by adopting a strategic thinking approach.

The Royal Brunei Armed Forces, which has reached the age of 53 years, is the country's foremost pillar of defence.

For this reason the Royal Brunei Armed Forces need to be even more solid and formidable, and be of higher calibre, in terms of being better able to overcome current obstacles, as well as in its role in fostering regional and international cooperation.

This year's RBAF anniversary celebration is organised by the Royal Brunei Air Force. The celebration is held each year in commemoration of the formation of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces on the 31st of May 1961.

On arrival, His Majesty was greeted by the Deputy Minister of Defence, Dato Paduka Haji Awang Mustappa bin Haji Sirat and the Commander of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces, Yang Dimuliakan Pehin Datu Pekerma Jaya Major General Dato Seri Pahlawan Mohammad Tawih bin Abdullah.

His Majesty's sons - His Royal Highness Prince General Al-Muhtadee Billah, the Crown Prince and Senior Minister at the Prime Minister's Office and General of the Royal Brunei Armed Forces; His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Malik; and His Royal Highness Prince 'Abdul Wakeel were also present at the celebration.

His Majesty consented to receive the Royal Salute, and inspect the Grand Guard of Honour shortly after his arrival at Hangar 'B' of the Royal Brunei Air Force Base.

The guard of honour was led by Lieutenant Colonel Air Force Mohamad Azmi bin Haji Mohamad Hussin and mounted by 1,150 members of the RBAF comprising personnel of the Royal Brunei Land Force, the Royal Brunei Navy, the Royal Brunei Air Force, the RBAF Training Institute, Special Forces Regiment, and Women military personnel.

The inspection of the Grand Guard of Honour was followed by the march-past in a slow pace followed by a quick march by the parade groups, which bore



His Majesty presents house keys to thousands

Bandar Seri Begawan, May 2 – A total of 1,542 people received the keys to their new homes in a ceremony held at the Indera Samudera Hall of the Empire Hotel and Country Club.

His Majesty Sultan Haji Hassanal Bolkiah Mu'izzaddin Waddaulah ibni Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar 'Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien, Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam, consented to present the house keys to the recipients.

Of the total, 980 are recipients of semi-detached and terrace houses in the National Housing Scheme (RPN) Tanah Jambu and RPN Meragang areas.

Meanwhile under the Land Scheme for the Indigenous Races (STKRJ), 213 residents received semi-detached and terrace houses in the Kampong Katok 'B' area, while another 349 people were awarded semi-detached and terrace houses in the Kampong Lugu area.

As of now, nearly 15,459 housing units have been allocated for applicants under the National Housing Programme and the Indigenous Land Award Scheme.

From this figure, 11,209 housing units are for applicants in the Brunei-Muara District.

The presence of His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam at the ceremony and His Majesty's consenting to present the keys to the recipients demonstrate the high level of care and attention by the monarch towards fulfilling and safeguarding the needs of the citizens and residents in the country. The handing over of house keys also means a higher quality of life for the citizens.

On arrival at the Indera Samudera Hall of the Empire Hotel and Country Club, His Majesty the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam was greeted by the Minister of Development, Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Indera Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Awang Haji Suyoi bin Haji Osman; the Minister of Home Affairs, Yang Berhormat Pehin Udana Khatib Dato Paduka Seri Setia Ustaz Haji Awang Badaruddin bin Pengarah Dato Paduka Haji Othman; and the Acting Brunei-Muara District Officer, Awang Mohammad Sunadi bin Haji Buntar.

Nearly 1,400 people live in Kampung Lugu and Kampung Katimahar which are provided with basic facilities including two schools and a mosque.

A few of the divisions are also equipped with its own laboratories such as the Pharmaceutical Laboratory, Microbiology Laboratory and Cosmetic Laboratory.

These laboratories are managed by the Drug Quality Control Division.

Before touring the new facility, HRH signed an inauguration plaque to mark the momentous occasion.

The Minister of Health, Pehin Dato Awang Haji Adnan, greeted HRH upon his arrival at the Pharmaceutical Services Department.

The building's construction started in 2011 as one of the projects under the National Development Plan.

The new method will be extended in

stages to other blood types if necessary and appropriate.

The minister added that this strategy is very important in ensuring that the country will always have the level of blood that is sufficient and safe according to designated international standards and SOP (Standard Operating Procedure).

The assembly was officiated by the Speaker of Brunei's Legislative Council, Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Laila Setia Bakti Diraja Dato Laila Utama Haji Awang Isa.

The Speaker of Brunei Darussalam's Legislative Council stated that AIPA recognises the importance of close cooperation and collaboration among the member nations for continuous stability as well as peace, prosperity and development in the ASEAN region and the importance of ASEAN Community well-being.

He explained that the AIPA Caucus is the best platform for ASEAN parliamentarians to further extend the

avenues of cooperation among their countries, and to focus its discussions on matters pertinent to issues that will contribute towards the achievement of ASEAN's noble vision.

He further added that the 34th AIPA General Assembly in Bandar Seri Begawan last year touched on the resolutions to amend the AIPA-Caucus terms of reference.

The amendment according to Yang Berhormat Pehin is considered as necessary to meet the conference requirement for a more effective outcome.

The amendment includes changes to the AIPA Caucus meeting regulations, to enable sub-conferences on focused and in-depth discussions of issues.

In addition to reviewing recommendations made during last year's general assembly, Brunei

Darussalam has also tabled another topic for discussion that is cooperation in higher education, technical and vocational education among ASEAN countries.

AIPA is a regional body designed to make legislative recommendations to ASEAN governments.

One of its goals is to promote policy cohesion among the 10-member regional bloc, which aspires to establish a European Union-style economic community by 2015.

This year's caucus was chaired by Yang Berhormat Haji Awang Ahmad Morshidi Pehin Orang Kaya Digadong Seri Diraja Dato Laila Utama Hj Awng Abd Rahman, a member of Brunei Darussalam's Legislative Council.

AIPA was established in 1977 to promote solidarity and discuss solutions to problems of common interest. Brunei Darussalam joined the body in 2009.

ASEAN needs to embrace the right technology to combat crime, urges Minister of Energy

Bandar Seri Begawan, June 24- The 14th ASEAN Senior Officials Meeting on Transnational Crime (SOMTC) was held at the Empire Hotel and country Club's Indera Samudra Grand Hall.

Minister of Energy at the Prime Minister's Office, Yang Berhormat (YB) Pehin Datu Singamanteri Colonel (Rtd) Dato Seri Setia (Dr) Haji Mohd Yasmin said at the opening that ASEAN countries need to strengthen capacity building to dismantle security threats.

"Personally, I believe adopting the right technology is central to achieving successes in our fight and ability of staying two or more steps ahead of criminal network," he told the delegates from 10 ASEAN countries.

"This is where ASEAN's partnerships with our dialogue partners add leverage to our respective capabilities, he added.

YB Pehin Dato Haji Yasmin also said that in order to strengthen collective action against transnational crime, ASEAN must abolish unnecessary bureaucracy.

"Transnational crime a major challenge to our aspiration to attain on ASEAN Political Security community, one of the three pillars of the ASEAN community 2015," he said.

This year's 14th Senior Officials Meeting on Transnational Crime (SOMTC) focused on combating terrorism, illicit drug trafficking, human trafficking and cybercrimes.

"Our region has not escaped unscathed," the minister added. "We increasingly need to deal with many new forms of organised crime that transcend national borders and political sovereignty such as terrorism, new types of drug abuse and trafficking, innovative forms of money laundering, arms smuggling, trafficking in women and children and piracy."

The 14th Senior Officials Meeting on Transnational Crime (SOMTC) was chaired by Dato Paduka Haji Hamdan bin Haji Abu Bakar, Permanent Secretary at the Prime Minister's Office.

Senior officials focused their discussion on the full implementation of the relevant provisions of the ASEAN Political Security Community Blueprint by 2015.

They also discussed the SOMTC Work Program, which lists eight areas of transnational crime including on illegal arms smuggling, money laundering, sea piracy and international economic crimes.

The Meeting commended the headway in programme implementation, the successful convening of the inaugural Working Group on Cybercrime, and the progress being made in the drafting of

the ASEAN Convention on Trafficking in Persons (ACTIP) and the Regional Plan of Action to Combat Trafficking in Persons (RPA).

The discussion was underlined by an emphasis on capacity building especially for front-line personnel and investigators and the use of technology in addressing transnational crime.

Senior Asean officials at the meeting also proposed the establishment of a regional training centre for investigation procedures as part of efforts to combat cross-border crime.

The meeting also embraced ways forward in achieving the objectives of formulating the next step in the fight against transnational crime post-2015.

Climate change must be taken seriously, says Minister of Development

BANDAR SERI BEGAWAN, June 12 - The government, through the Ministry of Development, has taken mitigating actions to reduce greenhouse gases and address climate change.

"Brunei has realised that climate change must be taken seriously," said the Minister of Development, Pehin Orang Kaya Indera Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Haji Suyoi.

The Ministry of Development recently released an Energy Efficiency Index (EEI) for primary and secondary schools, in a bid to reduce energy consumption in government-run institutions.

The Public Works Department (PWD) under the Ministry of Development collected data from over 48 government buildings, including 40 schools and eight commercial premises to come up with the benchmark for the EEI.

"The EEI baseline will be used to evaluate energy consumption and will become the benchmark for schools to ensure energy efficiency," said Pehin Orang Kaya Indera Pahlawan Dato Seri Setia Hj Suyoi at the launch of the EEI.

The Public Works Department has also created "Green Building Initiatives" to illustrate how the public can save energy, water and use energy-efficient products and technologies.

The minister said that, the Green Building Initiative is one of the mitigation moves by the Public Works Department in countering climate change.

The positive move is also a major transition in the industrial development by taking into account the «green concept» in the design, implementation and sustainable utilization.

"I believe that these green concepts can be applied and absorbed in government buildings and schools. This has also been extended and applied to private buildings in the future," added the minister.

The PWD has also posted on its website a list of "approved products" that employ energy efficient technology.



Ru'yah and Hisab: Marking the start of the month

Predicting the first sighting of the new crescent has been attempted since the time of the ancient Babylonians.

The ancient methods of moon sighting depended on the astronomical calculation of the Moon and the time difference between moonset and sunset.

The first sighting of the new crescent moon is used as the basis of various calendars to signal the start of the new month. For instance, Islam requires that the sighting of the new crescent moon should be made with the naked eye.

More modern techniques nowadays among others use the angular separation of the Sun and Moon, altitude difference between the Sun and Moon, as well as their relative azimuths and the width of the crescent.

The determination of the new crescent moon varies in several countries. There are some countries that only used the Ru'yah, while the others use Hisab or both of them.

Despite Muslim countries mastering the advanced technology of astronomy by using the Hisab method, some countries apparently still prefer to use Ru'yah by referring to a hadith (Prophet's tradition) narrated by Imam Bukhari that stated, "Do not fast unless you sight the crescent, and do not break your fast till you sight the (following) crescent."

Brunei Darussalam is one of the countries that follows the hadith narrated by Imam Bukhari as mentioned above and has its own moon sighting hills throughout the country.

The moon sighting locations in Brunei

are Bukit Shahbandar in Jerudong, Bukit Ambok and Padang Tembak Bukit Agok in Tutong, and Bukit Lumut in Belait.

The sightings of the new month will be reported to the authority and announced through radio and television by the high court Syariah judge.

Moon sightings in Brunei Darussalam in the past were conducted at the minaret of Sultan Omar Ali Saifuddin Mosque in Bandar Seri Begawan as it was considered one of the higher places in the country.

Whether the moon was sighted or not, it will be presented to His Majesty

the Sultan and Yang Di-Pertuan of Brunei Darussalam before it is announced.

Brunei has a community of astronomers who called themselves "Persatuan Astronomi Negara Brunei Darussalam" (The Astronomical Society of Brunei Darussalam).

They diligently conduct observations and give services on the current development of astronomy, including moon sighting, Kiblat direction, schedules of the Sun and the Moon, schedule of the planets, as well as star charts and planet positions.
